Discussion

- Introduction new to the group is; Robyn Curtis-Rice from Ivins Medical Group she is a nurse practitioner. Youxue Wang is a physician from Exact Science.
- WCP is currently proposing changes to the colorectal program to align with USPSTF guidelines for colorectal screening. When and if this get approved there will be a press release but for now it is currently being worked on.
- Decision Making Guide
 - Tanya presented draft to group to discuss layout and wording.
 - Recommendation from Robyn that if this is truly just a screening guide possible removing symptoms because it doesn't feel like it belongs in the sections.
 - Screening should be asymptomatic patient those that feel "I don't have symptoms I don't need to be screened."
 - One common comments Robyn gets a lot of patients that say I'm not having symptoms only need to be screened which is a big misconception among patients.
 - Younger with a family history talk to your doctor
 - Header idea's change to
 - There is no green light to skipping a cancer screening just because you don't have symptoms or a family history of cancer.
 - Don't wait until you have symptoms, it may be too late.
- Early detection would resonate better with patient then Screening Robyn felt.
- Check box's
 - Take out the referral box not need for a discussion
 - Move vaccines to education section
 - Also to make this more provider friendly as well by adding a line like when was your last pap etc.
- Star wanted feedback so you feel this discussion guide is useful, Robyn felt that this would be a good tool to use for patient and provider conversation.
