Prevention

Strategy Areas

- Improve community awareness of cancer risk and healthy and unhealthy behaviors
- Support implementation of evidence-based interventions for cancer prevention in healthcare settings, worksites, and learning institutions

Screening & Early Detection

Breast Cancer - Cervical Cancer - Colorectal Cancer - Lung Cancer

Strategy Areas

- Improve community awareness of screening guidelines and options, and the financial resources available to support screening
- Support healthcare partners in implementing evidence-based interventions to increase cancer screening and enrolling clients in the Wyoming Cancer Program Screening Program

Survivorship

Resources - Training

Strategy Areas

- Work with healthcare partners to improve access to resources that meet the practical, physical, mental, and emotional needs of cancer survivors
- Promote trainings for clinicians, mental health professionals, and patient navigators on the needs of survivors and the resources available to support them

Childhood Cancer

Treatment - Long-term & Follow-up Care - Resources

Strategy Areas

- Coordinate with Wyoming cancer centers and treating institutions in Salt Lake City and Denver to clarify roles and allowable support activities for pediatric cancer care
- Promote clinician, caregiver, and patient trainings and educational opportunities
- Expand access to local support networks and resources for patients and caregivers
